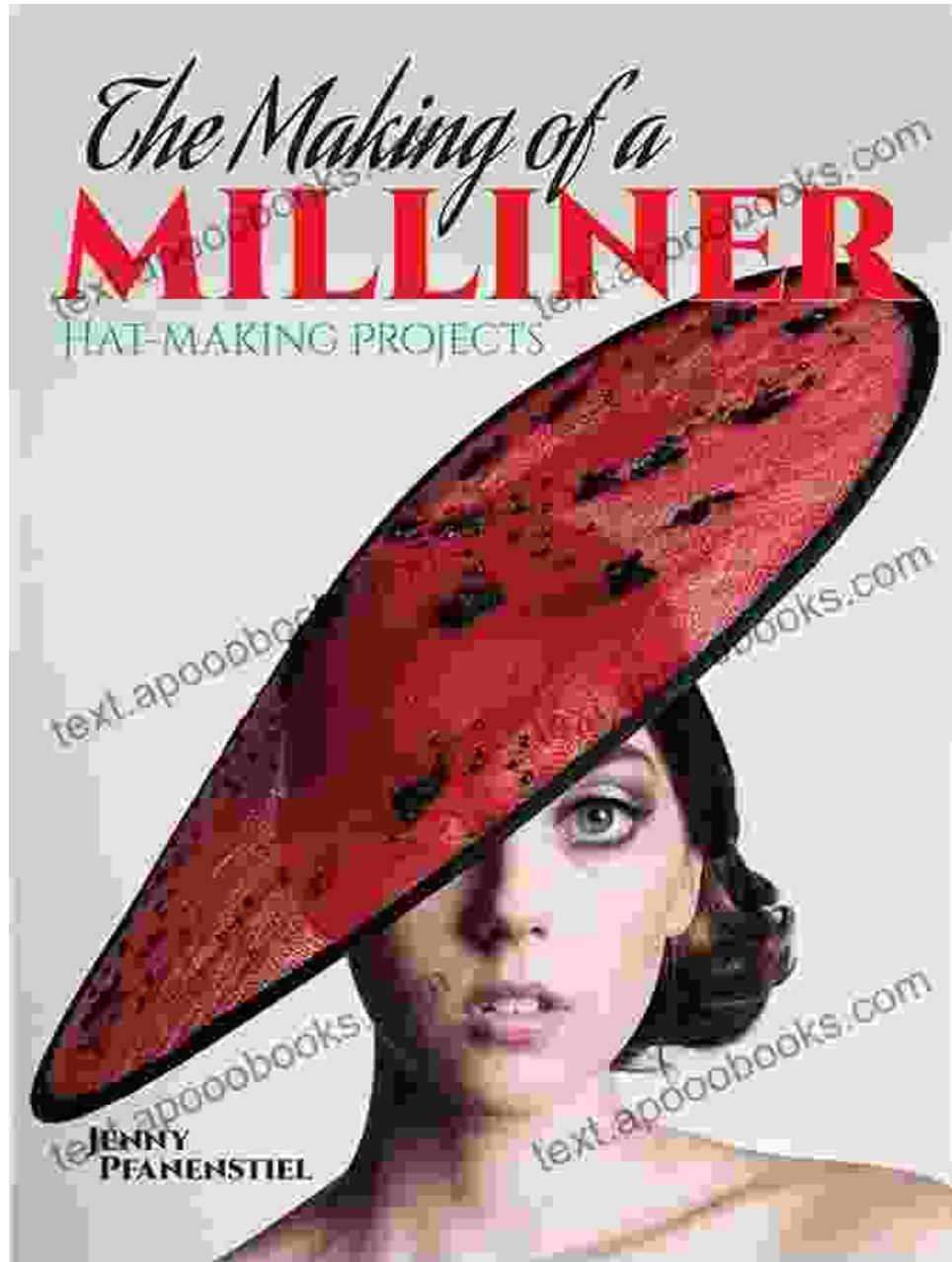
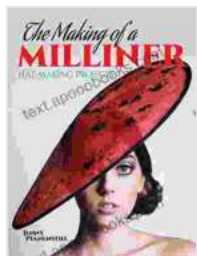

Corralled Ovens Hat

Crown Band. Turn your iron to the cotton setting. Press the hat on the crown block to hold it in place and to ensure you are measuring the outside band to the exact measurement of the crown block. Wrap the Petersham around the outside of the crown where it meets the brim. Add about 1" to 1 1/2" so you can fold it over nicely for a finished look.

We use the iron to create a nice curve in the Petersham. Because Petersham has scalloped edges, it will lie flat against the crown of the hat when it is worn on. Start at one end and begin to iron, shaping the curve with your other hand as you go. When finished, you should have a curved band.

Take the curved band and place it around the crown where it meets the brim, with the bigger edge of the curve closest to the brim. Put the ends of the Petersham where

your embellishment will go so they will be hidden under the embellishment. The embellishment should not be placed directly center front or on the side, but in between those points. To keep the band in place, tack down the bottom edge (closest to the brim) by hand. You want to tack down evenly, 3" to 4" all the way around. Be sure not to sew through the sweatband on the inside of the hat. Keep your stitches underneath the sweatband.

Embellish. Group together some coordinating feathers and sew around the sides so they stay together. Place the group of feathers behind the crown band and tack down. To complete the embellishment, sew a button over the band where the feathers meet.

Your hat is now completed your hand-blocked wool cowboy hat.

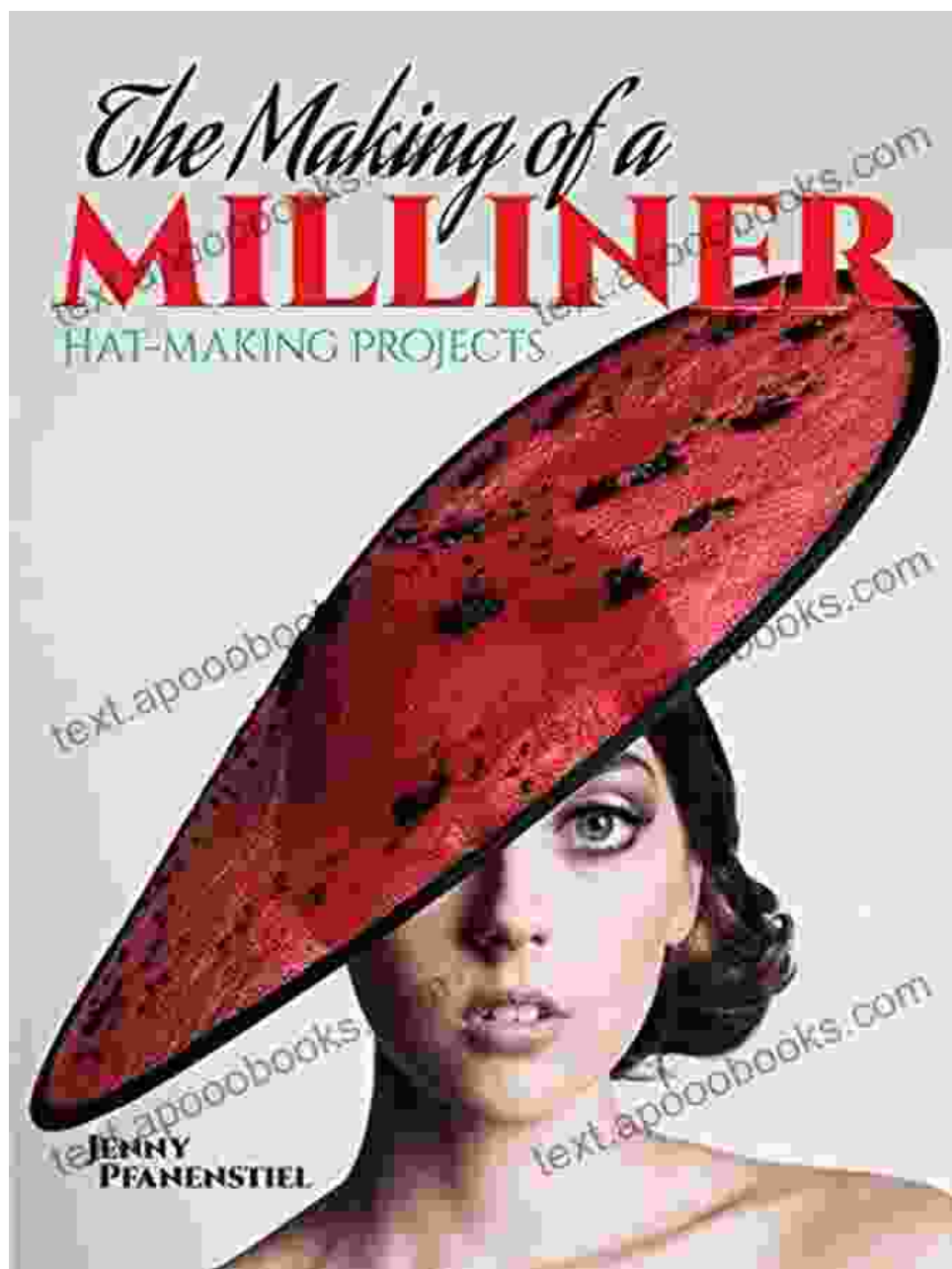

Embellish. Group together some coordinating feathers and sew around the sides so they stay together. Place the group of feathers behind the crown band and tack down. To complete the embellishment, sew a button over the band where the feathers meet.

Your hat is completed! Your hand-blocked wool cowboy hat.

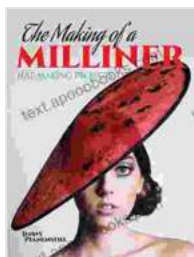

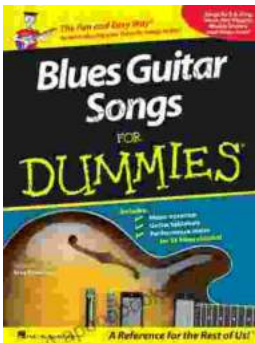
