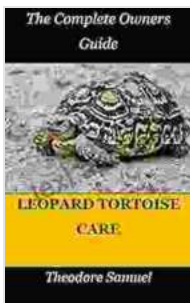

Choosing the Right Enclosure

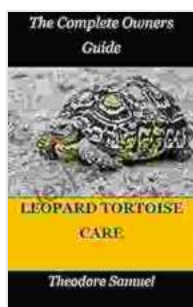
