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How do you know if you have head lice?

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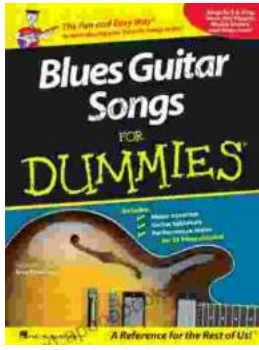
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
